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Inner-City Arts Awarded \$150,000 Grant from S. Mark Taper Foundation to Support Professional Development Institute

LOS ANGELES, Calif. (February 10, 2017) -- Inner-City Arts—a leading provider of quality arts education for underserved children in Los Angeles—has received a \$150,000, three-year grant from the **S. Mark Taper Foundation** to support and assist in further advancement of the existing Professional Development Institute program.

The Professional Development Institute at Inner-City Arts supports public education through a rigorous program designed to provided classroom teachers with engaging and meaningful strategies for integrating creativity into their core curriculum. Since its start in 1996, the Inner-City Arts Professional Development Institute has provided creativity-based training for more than 10,000 educators, serving a constituency of more than 1,000 educators annually. Through programming offered by the Professional Development Institute, educators, administrators and other partners, many of whom had no arts instruction in their own K-16 education, gain a firsthand experience with the arts and learn to build bridges between the arts and academic subjects.

In addition to general support for the program's current operations, the grant from the S. Mark Taper Foundation will also support the roll-out of new program offerings, including a re-launch of the series *STEAM Connections*. Originally piloted in January 2013, *STEAM Connections* focuses on the links between the Arts, Science, Technology, Engineering and Math. *STEAM* participants explore the intersection of creative process and scientific method through hands-on experiences which provide opportunities to create, test, evaluate, and present their work. The grant will also allow for the development of *Intersections* -- a series of facilitated conversations exploring theory, research and practice in arts education and related fields.
