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COURSE DESCRIPTIONS





M&H MIDDLE & HIGH SCHOOL



WEAVING

WED. | 4:30PM - 6:00PM

TEACHING ARTIST: IVAN LOPEZ

NOTE: This workshop starts 1 week late (on Feb 13).

Weaving is an ancient practice and trade that consists of combining two separate threads or yarn to create a piece of fabric or cloth. This studio offers students a foundation through learning how to construct and set-up a portable frame loom and experimenting with various textures, color, and design techniques. Students will be encouraged to use these tools and ideas to create work that is unique and experimental.

MASK MAKING

SAT. | 10:00AM - 12:00PM

TEACHING ARTIST: BETH PETERSON

Design, sculpt, and paint masks from your imagination. Masks are one of the most ancient Art

forms - found throughout the world. Learn about the history of masks and then create your own mask and through movement - bring it to life!

HIGH SCHOOL CERAMICS

SAT. | 1:30PM - 3:30PM

TEACHING ARTIST: MICHELLE SOLORIO

PRE-REQUISITE: At least one completed semester of Ceramics at Inner-City Arts

Wheel throwing: This class is designed for returning high school students to mainly focus on making work on the potter's wheel. We will explore all the different forms we can make, and turn them into functional cups, bowls and plates and even sculptures. You will paint your work with colorful glazes and all your work will be fired in the kiln. Learn all about the amazing process of ceramics as you transform raw clay into something of your own creation.

PORTFOLIO DRAWING: AN ART SCHOOL SAMPLER

SAT. | 1:30PM - 3:30PM

BOB BATES AND GUEST INSTRUCTORS FROM ART CENTER, JOHNNY CARSON CENTER FOR EMERGING MEDIA ARTS, AND SCI-ARC

In this workshop we will explore a variety of drawing techniques and tools while learning how to accurately draw from observation. This workshop is designed to support high school students who wish to develop their portfolio towards arts-based colleges and scholarships, and will feature guest instructors from top art schools sharing their insights and knowledge here on the Inner-City Arts campus.

ANIMATION 1.0: THE ANIMATION SAMPLER

SAT. | 10:00AM - 12:00PM

TEACHING ARTIST: ERICA LARSEN-DOCKRAY

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Principles of animation will be explored using various techniques including optical toys, flipbooks, draw/scratch on film, sand, stop motion, pixilation and more. Students will gain a basic understanding of how to control movement at the frame by frame level and utilize the two different processes to plan and execute their animation. Special workshops with studio and independent animators will be taking place throughout our sessions. No animation or drawing experience necessary, but a spirit of exploration is required!

ANIMATION 2.0: INTERMEDIATE ANIMATION

TEACHING ARTIST: ERICA LARSEN-DOCKRAY

Pre-requisite: At least 1 semester of Animation 1.0.

This second-level class is designed for returning students interested in going deeper in their learning of animation. In this course we will cover advanced animation principles utilizing animation exercises to sharpen skills. We will also touch on animation history, theory, production processes and software. Special workshops with studio and independent animators will be taking place throughout our sessions.





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CINEFLIX: THIS IS ME SAT. | 1:30PM - 4:30PM

TEACHING ARTIST: KWESI JOHNSON

In this workshop, students will craft films pertaining to an issue that affects their lives, whether political or personal. They will learn how to use the camera, light a scene, record sound, and put it all together in editing.

GRAPHIC DESIGN 1: PERSONAL MERCH DESIGN

TEACHING ARTIST: MINDY LEE

Bring your ideas to life! Graphic design is a powerful and beautiful way to communicate your voice, ideas and passions. In this workshop, you will learn how to turn your ideas, stories and interests into designs that communicate your own unique voice and style. Projects in this session include designing your own line of personal merchandize to tell your story. Designs will be applied to stickers, buttons, patches, T-shirt and posters. Digital tools used in this workshop are Adobe Illustrator and Adobe Photoshop.

GRAPHIC DESIGN 2: BRAND YOUR WORLD

Pre-requisite: Completion of Graphic Design 1.

Give your ideas an identity! Students will go in-depth into story-telling and layout design to develop their own branded magazine that communicates their deepest passions, interests and opinions. Students will create their own visual content using found images, typography and illustrations. Tools used in this workshop are Adobe Illustrator, Photoshop and InDesign.

GRAPHIC DESIGN 3: BRANDING STUDIO

Pre-requisite: Completion of Graphic Design 1 and Graphic Design 2 at Inner-City Arts; High commitment; Strong interest in growing your own brand; Some homework required.

Take your brand to the next level! Your brand is a way to tell your story and engage others to join in on your narrative. In this workshop, students will take their brand ideas (existing brands or ideas for a brand) through a design process that includes brand strategy, logo design, product design and brand collaboration. Students will bring new life and action steps that will make their brand seen and known.

INTRODUCTION TO DIGITAL MUSIC PRODUCTION (MS)

In this workshop, we'll use the program Ableton Live to create original pieces of music. Students will learn how to layer drum samples, record acoustic and MIDI instruments, mix their own songs, and create a SoundCloud page to share their music online.
