Clay on Canvas

Saturdays, 2:00-3:00pm Grade Levels: 6TH-8TH Grade

Level: Beginner Pre-Requisite: None You will learn how to create 3D canvas paintings made with clay and paint. You will learn beginning clay hand building techniques (such as coiling, sculpting, and carving) as well as beginning paintings techniques (such as paint mixing and blending). You will create painted clay works on canvas that include self-portraiture, landscapes, and abstract 3D canvas sculptures. You will learn how to use an additional medium (clay) to create mixed media paintings that add texture and depth to your artwork.

Creative Arts Pathways: Dance*

Tuesdays & Thursdays, 4:30-5:45pm Grade Levels: 6TH-8TH Grade

Level: Beginner/Intermediate

Pre-Requisite: None

Students will focus on foundational knowledge and skills needed to explore movement and build technique across multiple dance genres like hiphop, jazz, contemporary and ballet plus body conditioning for dance. Students will learn the fundamentals of choreography and improvisation with intent toward the process. Students will focus on developing their first artistic statement.

Creative Arts Pathways: Music*

Tuesdays & Thursdays, 4:30-5:45pm Grade Levels: 6TH-8TH Grade Level: Beginner/Intermediate

Pre-Requisite: None

Music courses will expose students to multiple musical genres (i.e. pop, R&B, jazz, rap, musical theater, classical, world music), developing confidence in singing abilities, understanding the voice and how to sing healthily, accompanying themselves on instruments while singing, and gaining a knowledge of the music theory they need to be able to write their own songs. It's an opportunity to build skills as they start their path to sharing their music with the world.

Hip Hop/Street Dance

Saturdays, 11:30am-1:00pm Grade Levels: 6TH-8TH Grade

Level: Intermediate

Pre-Requisite: Some dance training/

experience

HIP HOP/STREET DANCE will explore social dances from the 1970s to the most current TikTok moves. Through choreography and free-styling, you will learn the origins of dances as well as just how versatile they can become. As students work together in creative group exercises they also will embody Hip Hop's 4 Principles: Peace, Love, Unity, and Having Fun!

Intro to Acting

Saturdays, 11:30am-12:30pm Grade Levels: 6TH-8TH Grade

Level: Beginner Pre-Requisite: None You will learn the basics of acting through improv and creating your own characters and scenes. Understand the basics of storytelling through the lens of a performing artist. You will learn character development techniques of professional actors and how to put those characters in interesting, realistic situations!

Abstract Figure Drawing

Saturdays, 3:30-4:30pm Grade Levels: 6TH-12TH Grade Level: Intermediate

Pre-Requisite: Basic figure drawing

knowledge/interest

You will learn how to imagine, contort, tweak, and draw your own variations of both human and non-human figures. You will have the opportunity to use exaggeration and scale to play with our everyday reality and create abstract figures and characters through the use of different drawing materials (such as charcoal and colored pencils). You will learn how to hone your personal style by using abstract art making techniques (such as scrape painting and line drawing) to create characters that are uniquely your own.

Experimental Graphic Design for Apparel

Saturdays, 2:30-4:00pm Grade Levels: 6TH-12TH Grade

Level: All Levels Pre-Requisite: None Explore hand made and digital graphic design techniques—collage, printmaking, silkscreen, and Adobe Fresco— to create designs for t-shirts, bags, and hats. You will learn about artists and designers that use these techniques in their practices, the history of technology in image reproduction, and more!

Intro to Animation

Saturdays, 11:30am-1:00pm Grade Levels: 6TH-12TH Grade

Level: All Levels Pre-Requisite: None Welcome to Intro to Animation! This class is recommended for beginners, novices, and intermediate levels that are ready to engage with the basics and fundamentals of animation. With the animation world being so varied and dynamic with styles such as CGI, stop motion, and flash, our class, tackles the core initial lessons of 2D animation. So bring your focus, patience, and drive—it's magic time!

Kinetic Sculpture: Art that Moves!

Level: Beginner Pre-Requisite: None Are you interested in making things move? Are you interested in making sculptures? In this class you get to do both!
