Inner-City Arts and TeenTix LA invite youth to night of live theater

LOS ANGELES, Calif. (April 2024) — Greater LA youth have a fantastic **Teen Night at the theater** in store **April 26 at 6 p.m.**, when live performance and "artivism" will fill the incredible Inner-City Arts campus downtown. The unique voices of local teenagers helped playwright Megan Tabaque create "Antigone's Last Birthday," an original adaptation of the ancient Greek tragedy Antigone by Sophocles premiering during this event. In collaboration with TeenTix LA, the performance of this new Latine tale of power, resilience, and relentless fervor of teen girls as agents of change, will include a talk back with the young cast, art-making focused on youth activism, networking with other creative teens, information from other arts and activist organizations on local teen offerings, and much more!

Since 2021 TeenTix LA has led efforts to increase regional arts and culture accessibility for teens, following 20 years of TeenTix success in Washington state. Its mission to decrease barriers keeping youth in LA County from enjoying the region's rich cultural opportunities aligns with Inner-City Arts' 35-year history of fostering a creative community for all youth and families in the city. Michael Sample, Inner-City Arts' co-artistic director, says, "We are grateful for this partnership, providing access to live performance for teen audiences, both in our Rosenthal Theater and throughout Los Angeles. We're inspired by how the teen leadership is collaborating to produce this event alongside our teen performers, using theater and the arts for positive change in our community."

Local teens and their advocates are welcome to this free night of thought-provoking theater and eye-opening access to the many offerings for youth to explore self-expression through the arts. "Attendees will discover the invaluable resource that TeenTix LA represents," Allison Whorton, the organization's program director, says. "We hope this will be a space where teenagers can forge connections, celebrate each other's creativity, and uncover ways to feel better connected to the arts scene in LA."
