Program Structure



- The program is year round
- Rigorous application process every spring

- During school weeks: 10 hours/week of mandatory activities and meetings (Saturdays and after school)
- During winter/spring/holiday breaks: up 20 hours/week
- Interns are with us for 1-2 years







